Integrated Digital Educational Leadership for the Future Teaching Academy

This research is being undertaken by a collaborative partnership between Mary Immaculate College, LCETB, University of Latvia, Fundación SIGLO22, Autonomous University of Madrid and University of Rennes 2 as part of a European Erasmus plus teacher academy.

What is the aim of the study?

The IDEAL Futures project aims to develop a teacher academy that enables teachers and educational leaders to engage in evidence based digital transformation in their educational contexts through the provision of professional development programmes.

This study will consider the experiences of teachers in engaging in digital learning and associated professional development. This data will be used to design the relevant professional development to support participants.

- Explore teachers and educational leaders' experiences of digital learning leadership
- Identify the key challenges, problems and dilemmas facing pre-service and in-service teachers in a digital era at individual, school and community levels
- Formulate scenarios based on the experiences and challenges to enable teachers and educational leaders to identify and identify opportunities for teachers to re-envision and lead a transformative approach to digital leadership in education.
- Identify and understand the difficulties pre-service, in-service and educational leaders face in engaging in PD and how to support them in developing their digital educational leadership skills.

What will I be required to do if I volunteer to participate?

You are invited to participate in a short 10 minute survey that asks you to tell us about

- Your background
- The skills you feel are relevant to educators and educational leaders in a digital era
- The professional development needs of educators and educational leaders in a digital era

Note participation is entirely voluntary you are not under any obligation to participate, this will not affect your grade in any way.

How will my information/privacy be protected?

No personal data will be collected as part of the study. Open ended data will be anonymised to ensure your identity is protected. All data collected will be stored on an MIC-issued password protected encrypted computer. The data will be viewed only by the research team.

How will the data be used and consequently disposed of?

The results of this research will inform the development of reports which will be circulated to the European Commission, policy makers and other educators. In addition the data will inform challenge based narrative scenarios. The data may also be disseminated at national and international conferences and submitted for



publication in peer reviewed journals. In each instance the data will be presented collectively where possible and where not the data will be anonymised.

What are the benefits of participating in this study?

Participation in this study will support the development of a teacher academy in digital educational leadership which will provide collaborative professional development . It will benefit pre-service teachers, in-service teachers and educational leaders.

What are the risks involved in participating in this study?

There are no significant risks associated with participating in this project. Do I have the right to withdraw?
